

Access to Data for the development and deployment of advanced tools (based on AI and others) requires a move from a central exchange mechanism, with central permission management, to open standards (FHIR)


Game Changer: providing the patient with the ability to decide with whom to share his data

Open Questions


Can we rely on existing regulatory frameworks
